Patriotic...their knowledge and their station are always ready for the service of his country and their community." This coming year, 2009, would be a great time for all of us to make the tenants of this creed a part of our individual practice of our hobby. Above all lets all make sure our hobby is "fun."

LEARNING CW and IMPROVING CODE SPEED by Dave KR4U

At the last SPARC meeting one of our members, Ray N4EAT, asked if we could get some type of code improvement program going. I learned of an organization through a mutual friend of Leslie WA4EEZ and myself who was visiting our area from Virginia..Karen W4KRN. It is the "Straight Key Century Club" or SKCC for short. They have an excellent website at www.skccgroup.com and I urge anyone interested in code to check it out. After filling out a very basic form you are assigned a member number which is used during various events held by the club. The group holds at least two events per month and I recently took part in one of the sprints..Great fun and you meet lots of good folks. At this time two other SPARC members belong to the group..Doug KI4SNS and Pete WB2SUN. I contacted the public information officer and he sent me an excellent write up which follows. This is an excellent opportunity for folks to get on CW and make contacts at their speed comfort level, one can start out very slowly and go up from there at the same time meet nice operators and most of all...HAVE FUN...de Dave KR4U.

From SKCC



Remember when you had to learn Morse code to get licensed, and the feeling of elation you got when you made your first contact, worked your first DX, or earned your first certificate, all with CW. Or, are you just curious about CW as a mode, and want to see what all the fuss is about. Either way, you may well feel that your code skills need honing so that you don't embarrass yourself attempting a QSO. No doubt, SPARC has a CW op or two that will be happy to elmer you. Dave Trewin, KR4U, is one such operator, and you would be wise to make use of his experience.

Another approach that appeals to many, is to join a CW specialty club. A good example is the Straight Key Century Club (SKCC). The SKCC was formed nearly 3 years ago, by a small group of dedicated brass pounders, and now has a membership of nearly 5,000 ops. Membership is free, you are a member for life, and there are awards, a newsletter, Elmer's, and even contests and sprints for members to enjoy. The SKCC Purpose Statement has just three points:

To promote the use of Morse code, particularly using straight keys, bugs, or sideswipers (cootie keys). To help, encourage, and elmer new CW operators.

Listen for SKCC activity on, or around, the suggested operating frequencies: 1.820 3.530 3.550 7.055 7.113* 7.120 10.120 14.050 18.080 21.050 24.910 28.050

On the internet, look for our website at www.skccgroup.com. You will find full information there on membership, activities, awards, and scads of other items of interest.

Note: 7.113 is our slow speed, elmered, calling frequency. Call CQ there at a shaky 4 wpm, and you will be answered, and welcomed, at a clean 4 wpm. Your speed is our speed.



My Old Ham Shack by Ray Vaillancourt N4EAT




My Old Ham shack


