



POTA is a 501(c)3 radiosport program that encourages communications to and portable operations from state, provincial and nationally managed public lands.


POTA has a large set of references and a short set of rules. We welcome you to join us as an activator, chaser or both!

How to join the POTA fun!


Creating an account is fast and easy.



What do I need to activate a POTA reference?

- Amateur radio license
- Any radio
- Any portable antenna
- Portable power or access to AC power
- Any logger that will export an ADIF
- A desire to have fun





How do I activate a POTA reference?

Make 10 QSOs on one UTC day while inside the boundaries of the park on any band your privileges allow including WARC bands.

Utilize any simplex mode including satellite. No terrestrial repeaters allowed.

POTA recommends operating in the General bands but has no specific calling frequencies.

There is no specific exchange beyond callsign, although the traditional RST is usually given along with QTH. If you prefer, you do not have to call CQ POTA or announce you are at a park.

Log the date, time, and band in your favorite logging program and export as an **ADIF**. Submit this **ADIF** to your call area coordinator along with your call and POTA park number.

A good filename example is: 20190101 k8vox k-1234.adi

How do I call CQ?

On SSB any variation of the following:

"CQ Parks on the Air CQ POTA This is AA0O activating Park K-1880"




On CW we often hear:

"CQ POTA N2CX N2CX K0710 K"

Then put yourself on the POTA Spotter and you will be hunted!

Schedule an activation and the CW Reverse Beacon Network (RBN) can pick up your signal and you'll be automatically spotted!

To get spotted by the RBN, repeat your callsign twice like "CQ POTA W3AAX W3AAX K3331 K"











Park to Park awards for communications between portable operations at POTA references.

Awards for activating the same park many times as a Repeat Offender






RaDAR Awards for rapid deployment activations in a specified number of parks in one day



- Check your dashboard for stats at **parksontheair.com**



Tips for Hunting

- Check the POTA Scheduler for any planned activations
- Follow our social media for pop-up activations
- Watch the POTA spotter at http://pota.us
- Sign up for Slack to receive instant POTA spots on your phone or desktop
- Use phonetics or QRS if necessary
- Observe the DX Code of Conduct
- Spot to the POTA spotter or if you prefer to a cluster with comment: POTA K-1234 (or VE-1234)

- You are helping another amateur to reach their goals
- It's an easy, short contact great for new HF operators.
- Enjoy the comprehensive stats and awards POTA provides.
- It requires no log submissions
- It makes you a better operator and keeps your skills sharp.
- You will make friends from all over world
- You can hunt as much or as little as you want, you do not even have to register to play.
- You can help the activators by relaying things like "you have a Park to Park calling" or by spotting when they QSY



Top Activator Challenges

- Terrestrial & Solar Wx
- Gear failure have field repair kit and back ups
- Local QRM work through it or choose another location
- Difficult Staff while rare, it does happen. Always be respectful and follow staff instructions.
- Unable to self spot check in on Facebook or Slack with an ETA and frequency while you have network/cellular coverage.





Activator Pro Tips

- Safety first, flag anything that could be a tripping hazard.
- Have a checklist that you keep updated as your activating evolves
- Monitor a wx radio if you are in a place or season where wx can change rapidly
- Keep data you need at your fingertips POTA reference, county, grid square
- Leave time to tour the park, and choose the best operating position.
- Consider band conditions and your battery, TX power and length of activation.
- Be clear on the rules. Consider park rules, state laws, band plans, and other events you may be able to operate in concert with your activation.
- Be persistent and flexible!



My equipment

- Yaesu FT-891 transceiver (100W, no tuner) in Harbor Freight case
- 15Ah Bioenno LiFePo4 battery (also have 12Ah and 7Ah AGM)
- Spiderbeam 12m telescoping mast
- SSB Resonant Antennas:
 - 20m speaker wire dipole
 - 40m vertical with elevated radials, also made from 14ga speaker wire
- 50ft RG-8X coax

Depending on location:

60W solar panel, AGM solar controller, inline power meter, headphones, laptop, antenna analyzer, folding table






